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MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 148- 2020

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING AND PENALIZING ANY PERSON, NATURAL OR JURIDICAL, FROM CAUSING OBSTRUCTION/S ON STREETS, SIDEWALKS, AVENUES, ALLEYS, PUBLIC ROADS, BRIDGES, PARKS AND OTHER SIMILAR PUBLIC PLACES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF POLILLO, QUEZON

BE IT ENACTED by the Sangguniang Bayan of the Municipality of Polillo, in session duly assembled:

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Municipal Ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Anti-Street Obstruction Ordinance" of the Municipality of Polillo, Quezon.

SECTION 2. SCOPE OF APPLICATION. This Municipal Ordinance covers all kinds of obstructions on the Streets and other public places in the Municipality of Polillo, Quezon committed by individuals, entities and companies other than those obstructions committed by persons while driving or operating motor vehicles and all other forms of conveyances.




SECTION 4. PROHIBITION. It is prohibited and considered unlawful for any person or group of persons, entity or company to obstruct the free flow of people, goods and vehicles through the Municipality's road network by using, utilizing or otherwise appropriating any street, sidewalk or pedestrian walkway, avenue, alley, public roads, bridge, park and other public place or portion thereof for commercial or personal purposes. The prohibition includes all kinds of obstructions and is not limited to the following:

- a. To utilize as shop, working area, warehouse, office or for any other purpose related to the conduct of his/its business;
- b. To utilize as extension in the conduct of any business undertaking;
- c. Vending or selling of foods (kakanin, taho, junk foods, mineral water, peanuts, candies, hard boiled eggs, fruits), magazines, newspapers, cigarettes, flowers, brooms, watches or jewelries, shoes and other footwear, and/or any other items;
- d. Conduct of shoe-shine occupation
- e. Seeking of alms or solicitation of funds for whatever activity;
- f. Stationing of Persons with Disabilities or PWDs e.g. blind with guitar, cripple with a crutch, mother with a baby and the like to beg/ask for charity;
- g. Conduct of family gatherings/celebration, picnics or parties and merry-making activities, and drinking alcoholic or intoxicating beverages;
- h. Doing household chores such as washing clothes, hanging clothes and/or bathing;
- i. Vehicle garage and/or vehicle repair;
- j. To utilize for the conduct of other activities related to transport, i.e. barkers/call boys inviting passengers to board for-hire vehicles; line of passengers waiting to board for-hire vehicles and as terminal of for-hire vehicles and as terminal of for-hire vehicles;
- k. Garbage dumping site;
- l. Setting up of basketball court, playing basketball or scheduling a seasonal competition;
- m. Public/barangay structures and outpost;
- n. Rice, grains drying station and similar items (DPWH DO No. 73, Series of 2014)
- o. Humps, whether permanent or temporary, (DPWH DO No. 73, Series of 2014)
- p. School barricade

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- q. Use of sidewalk to strap/hitch animals, fowls and the like, with or without cage/pen;
- r. Storing soft drinks or wine/liquor bottles and cases (empty or not);
- s. Storing of junks, motor vehicles and/or parts and other recyclable materials;
- t. Use of sidewalk for storage of construction materials for sale (pipes, tubings, cement and the like);
- u. House extension or stall/store extension, including installation of roofs or awnings;
- v. Installation of permanent or picket fence;
- w. Use of sidewalk for installation of required signages for projects
- x. Use of sidewalk for plants, trees and plant boxes;
- y. To place stones/rocks/cement stabs/hollow blocks and/or car tires;
- z. To place wood or iron structure, especially those mark with "no parking" sign; and detached from the establishment

Conduct of religious activities, such as preaching, processions or holding of a wake or other community affairs like fiestas, games/amusement activities should be coordinated with the Barangay Council concerned and the Traffic and Parking Management Department.

Temporary closure of streets, to be used as venue for tiangge or perya during fiesta or other occasions should be coordinated with the Office of the Municipal Mayor for Barangay Poblacion and with the Barangay Council concerned for their approval.

All items, goods and structures found on or along roads, streets, avenues, alleys, sidewalks, bridges, parks and other public places shall be confiscated by the Local Government without prior notice. The same shall be treated as common or ordinary garbage and shall be disposed of as such.

Provided, that food commodities may be given to the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology as food of prisoners or street children. The Local Government shall not be held liable for any damage arising from the removal, confiscation or disposal of the said items.

SECTION 5. It shall be unlawful for owners of residential and commercial establishments which are located along Municipality roads to allow sidewalk vendors to use the street frontage of their establishments to sell their goods and other merchandise or to give consent to the use of an area inside their establishments in order to avoid being apprehended by enforcers on sidewalk vendors.

SECTION 6. ENFORCEMENT – This Municipal Ordinance shall be implemented and enforced by the Office of the Municipal Mayor, Office of the Municipal Engineer, Punong Barangays, Philippine National Police (PNP) and other government officials or authorities concerned.

SECTION 7. PENALTIES – Violation of this Municipal Ordinance shall upon conviction be penalized as follows:

First Offense	Fine of Five Hundred Pesos (Php500.00)
Second Offense	Fine of One Thousand Pesos (Php1,000.00)
Third and Succeeding	Fine of Two Thousand Pesos (Php2,000.00) or imprisonment of one (1) month or both at the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 8. If the offender is an organization, partnership or corporation, the penalty provided for under this Municipal Ordinance shall be imposed upon the President or General Manager or Managing Partner or the person-in-charge of the organization, partnership or corporation.

SECTION 9. REPEALING CLAUSE . All Municipal Ordinances and other existing rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with this Municipal Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 10. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any part or provision of this Municipal Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other parts or provisions hereof.

SECTION 11. EFFECTIVITY Clause. This Municipal Ordinance shall be executed and declare effective immediately upon compliance of all process of Municipal Ordinance enactment.
